PLEASE USE THIS GUIDE FOR INPROCESSING TO NYLT 2014

- 1. Eat lunch before arriving. Check in begins at the Gorham Check In Shelter at 11:30 am and ends promptly at 12.45pm on June 1st, 2014. Please DO NOT unload any gear until directed to do so.
- 2. At the check in shelter there will be four stations:
 - **a. Station 1:** An adult staff member will check your registration and personal information. Please make sure to pay your fees before you arrive at camp and prior to the deadlines listed on the registration form.
 - **b. Station 2:** Medical Review: Our Camp Medical Officer will review your BSA Part A, B and C Physical. The Physical must be reviewed and signed by an physician and be less than one year old. Physicals older than 8 June 2013 will not be accepted and you will not be allowed to further process without permission of a Council Executive. Please make sure you have your "Over-the-Counter" dispensation form signed by your parent. Also, if you have prescription medications, make sure they are contained in a one gallon zip lock bag with your name on it.
 - **c. Station 3:** At this station your picture will be taken. Your picture will be used to make an ID Badge, which you must wear at all times, unless otherwise directed. You will also be given course training materials at this time.
 - **d. Station 4:** You will receive your NYLT t-Shirt and cap. We must place orders for these items well in advance of conducting the course. If you register late, you may not receive the t-shirt and cap. You will also be given several feet of colored survey ribbon. This is the time to get your gear. Each piece of gear should be "marked" using the colored ribbon you are given. You will be directed where to stack your gear. This is a great time to say your "good-byes". At Station 5, you will essentially begin the course. Please proceed to Station 5 quickly as others will be waiting for you.
 - **f. Station 5**: After you have stacked your gear, report to the Senior Patrol Leader at Station 5. He will pair you up with other students and a Troop Guide. The Guide will take you on a tour of the orientation trail. Your gear will be hauled to camp for you.
