Boy Scouts - Wood Badge DAC

To attend a Wood Badge course, Scouters must:

- 1) Be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. (There are no minimum tenure requirements.)
- Have completed the basic training courses for their Scouting position.
 - a. This is Scouting (All adult leaders) Leader specific training for
 - b. Den leaders
 - c. Cubmasters
 - d. Webelos leaders
 - e. Tiger Cub leaders
 - f. Pack committee members

- g. Troop committee members
- h. Scoutmasters and assistant Scoutmasters
- i. Varsity Scout Coaches and assistant Coachesj. Commissioner basic training for District and
- k. Previous versions of leader training courses are acceptable prerequisites.

- 3) Have completed the outdoor skills training programs appropriate for their Scouting position.
 - a) Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (required for Scoutmasters, assistant Scoutmasters and Varsity Coaches and assistants)
 - (All participants are encouraged to complete the Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills training before attending a Wood Badge course, but it is *not* required.)
- 4) Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. Successful completion of the BSA class 3 physical is required for all participants.
- 5) Note: Individuals who have attended Wood Badge in the past (either Cub Scout Trainers' Wood Badge or Boy Scout Leader Wood Badge) may attend provided that:
 - a) They agree to write and work a Wood Badge for the 21st Century ticket.
 - b) They agree not to wear Wood Badge beads until they have satisfactorily completed their Wood Badge for the course they are taking.

Wood Badge Coordinator

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Wood Badge is an advanced leadership skills course for all adult volunteers that focuses on strengthening a leader's ability to work with and lead groups of youth and adults. The course provides a great opportunity to enjoy the outdoors, learn new skills and share experiences with adult leaders from other units.
