Lowe's Gift card available for Eagle Projects

In 2012 Lowe's Home Improvement Stores gave the National Council of the Boy Scouts a very significant number of \$100. gift cards to be used towards Eagle projects. In 2012 Annawon Council was issued only 6 cards that we could issue. On a national basis, many were not used and were returned to National.

The program has been revised and reestablished for 2013. Annawon Council has applied for, and has been granted, the opportunity to give out 20 of these cards. Because of the larger number available, they will be distributed on a first come - first serve basis. Once the application is received by the Council, the application will be sent to National who will arrange for the distribution of the gift cards. It is expected that the cards may take up to 30 days to be received, but hopefully quicker.

It also appears that the rules for the use of these cards had been relaxed a bit. They are good wherever Discover cards are accepted. They can not be used for food or tools. Any unused cards must be returned to national and may not be turned over to the project beneficiary. The Eagle candidate must submit receipts, some photos and a short report online. While, the gift cards do not need to be used at Lowe's, I am sure all would agree that would be a good place to use them if possible. The program will end the beginning of 2014. There will be a council coordinator for this, who will monitor the paperwork and assist you in the program should you need it.

On average, we have approximately 40 - 50 Scouts who attain the rank of Eagle each year, so we do not expect any problem in being able to use up the gift card allotment. There may be the possibility to get more gift cards if we can use them and if there are any that are not allocated out on a national basis.

If you are interested in obtaining a gift card, please apply soon, as we hope to run out. The paperwork is fairly simple, and as such this seems like an easy way to raise \$100. of much needed funding for an Eagle project!!

Quick-Step Guide for Participation in Lowe's National Eagle Scout Project Impact Grants

Council recruits Lowe's project follow-up volunteer.
 Scout executive or staff designee (or key volunteer under certain conditions) sends notification of participation to

with the council name, the number of grants desired (up to 25), the Scout executive's or staff designee's name, and the name and email address of the follow-up volunteer.

3. Council and district advancement committees then identify Scout recipients for the grants.

This year, the Lowe's service project impact grants will take a different approach. Most importantly, the \$100 Discover gift card grants will be mailed directly to Eagle Scout candidates. Local councils need only select the Scouts to receive cards and then, through a council-desgnated volunteer, follow up to see that participating Scouts submit their required reports. Local councils will not receive the cards and will have no responsibility to record or distribute them.

Each council may reserve as many as 25 gift cards by sending a message to

lowes.grant@scouting.org , notifying the BSA Advancement Team of the council's intent to participate. This notification of

participation must include the council name, Scout executive's or staff designee's name, the name and email address of one council-



If you are a Scout interested in this grant opportunity for your Eagle Scout service project, you must contact your local council service center. You may use the grant application form found here . if your council is not aware of the Year 2 Lowe's service project impact grants, you may suggest they visit the above website, or send a message to lowes.grant@scouting.org council use may be found here ...

4. Follow-up volunteers will receive links to a web page where they may enter the names and postal addresses of Scouts as they are identified. As these are received at the national office, Scouts will be sent their gift cards.

Upon receipt of a notification of participation that includes all of the information mentioned above, the Advancement Team will send a link to the council's designated follow-up volunteer that will allow electronic submission of the names and addresses of the Scouts who are to receive the gift cards. As the Scout recipients are submitted, the Advancement Team will send the gift cards directly to the Scouts.
