The WEBELOS Woods weekend campout program reinforces many values important to all Scouts: understanding Boy Scouts, appreciation of the workings of a Scout Troop and the patrol method, introduction to advanced Scouting skills, the thrill of camping in the great outdoors, and a strong desire to continue Scouting as a Boy Scout in a boyrun Troop.

Troops – We need you to run a station to help teach the Scouting skills that the WEBELOS will need when they become Boy Scouts. Some Ideas on Stations are: Knots, Compass use, Shelters, Leave no Trace, Cooking, and Staying Found, GPS usage, Water Purification, Fire Making, First Aid & First Aid Kits, 72 hour kits and other Survival Skills.

Packs – Come and learn the skills that all Scouts need. WEBELOS Woods is a great opportunity to see Boy Scouts in Action and have a great time. Attend interesting sessions, try out the BB and archery ranges and get some great camping experience.

Parking – Parking is always a problem at this event so we would like to ask for your help to make sure things go as smoothly as possible. <u>Carpooling is very important</u>. We need to reduce the number of vehicles in camp.

### Check-in/check-out

### Please make all checks for payment out to ANNAWON COUNCIL Please.

Troops may arrive at Camp Norse beginning at 5:30PM on Friday evening. Please send a representative to the Administration Building with a copy of the Troop roster and payment to check-in when you arrive. Webelos and their leaders, parents and adult partners should check in at the administration building with their sponsoring Troop on Saturday Morning. Check in will start at 7:00am and each pack should bring a copy of their roster and check for payment to the admin building. Sponsoring troops can also help with meal planning and equipment. If you can't locate a troop to match up with, let us know and we might be able to help you find one. The intent here is for all Webelos to attend with a Troop. A package containing the weekend's activities will be distributed after a roster and health history of ALL Scouts, Scouters, parents and camping guests is presented. One vehicle may proceed to the camping area for unloading, but the vehicle MUST be moved to a designated parking area afterwards.

Participation ribbons will be available upon checkout. Please have your site inspected before leaving. Deposits for buildings will be returned after the Camp Master has inspected the facility.

### Troops running a station

Troops planning to run a station on Saturday should register with the event organizer, Greg Turgiss. Please keep the theme in mind when planning your troop's activity. We need stations on Boy Scout Skills, the requirements for a scout to advance to the rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Class, some Ideas are:

Knots, Rope, and Lashings	72 Hour Kits
Survival cooking	Native plant
Identify local poisonous plants; tell how to treat for exposure to them. Without a first aid kit	Wild Animal Identification and their tracks
Compass and Map usage	Water Purification
Basic First Aid and First aid kits	Find directions during the day or night without a compass.
Emergency signals	Stoves
Rock Climbing	First Aid Kits

#### Notes:

- A patch, Jamboree style campsite and unit flag participation ribbon are included in the \$6.00 per person fee which is due at check-in time. Please pay by the unit and not individually.
- Reservations can be made by a troop or pack online at the Annawon Council web site. Units should pay when they check in at camp.
- Each Troop can bring something to contribute to the cracker barrel on Friday night.
- Class A uniform required for all Scouts for flag ceremonies.
- No camouflage clothing or clothing with offensive wording or images. Proper Scouting attire and behavior at all times.
- The Webelos Woods program includes overnight camping and there is no single day option.
- Webelos must be accompanied by an adult partner at a 2:1 ratio.
- Webelos camping rules apply; two deep leadership always.
- Packs, ask your Troop about helping with the food and preparation.
- All attendees must register and have medical form and permission slip.
- Cabins may be rented by units for an additional fee if they are not being used for staff or activities.
- No vehicles are allowed in camp except to tow the unit trailer to the site. The tow vehicle must be removed immediately after unpacking.


