## THE MERIT BADGE PROGRAM IS ONE OF SCOUTING'S BASIC CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT TOOLS.

- This is accomplished by putting boys in contact with as many different counselors as possible, with whom they may not be acquainted. (Remember the Scout must bring a buddy to each meeting.)
- Counselors must be actively involved in the merit badges they counsel.
- You must renew your merit badge certification **every three (3) years**. All counselor registrations expire May 31<sup>st</sup>. You will be contacted by mail to when it is time to renew.
- Child Abuse is a serious problem in our society. BSA has established youth protection guidelines to protect the youth and adults involved in Scouting. As a counselor, you must give each Scout individual attention, however, you must not work alone with him. A Scout must have a buddy (another Scout, friend, or parent), and it is recommended that the counselor have a member of his/her, own family visibly present at all times. You MUST complete Youth Protection Training, online at <a href="https://www.myscouting.org">www.myscouting.org</a>, or by DVD from the Council Service Center, 804-355-4306 and attach the Youth Protection Training certificate of completion to your application in order to become a registered Merit Badge Counselor.

## AS A MERIT BADGE COUNSELOR, I AGREE TO:

- 1. Follow the requirements in the most current merit badge pamphlet, ensuring that the advancement standards are **FAIR and UNIFORM for all Scouts.**
- 2. Make sure the Scout has a merit badge application card **SIGNED** by his UNIT LEADER **before** he begins the badge.
- 3. Without changing the requirements, make the Scout aware of the **DEEPER** aspects of the subject from my knowledge and experience.
- 4. Require the Scout to bring a **BUDDY** (another Scout, friend or parent) to all merit badge sessions.
- 5. Keep my REGISTRATION CURRENT, if I plan to continue as a counselor. **Please keep a copy of this completed application for your records.**
