Aside from the year long 100th Anniversary celebration, we accomplished many objectives in 2010 that helped to build the council and the Scouting program stronger for the next 100 years!


- The council balanced the budget thanks in part to Friends of Scouting, popcorn, special events, camping revenue, foundation grants and bequest.

- Conducted multiple trainings throughout the year, including first Cub Scout Leader Pow Wow in over 10 years.
- 7% of registered Boy Scouts attained the rank of Eagle Scout (National average is 2%).
- Chumash Lodge of the Order of the Arrow earned Quality Lodge for the third year in a row.
- Expanded service operations in the Santa Maria area by moving service center to the Town Center Mall.
- Fireside Chats were held within each district by the council key leadership to acquire feedback on a strategic plan.

100th ANNIVERSARY HIGHLIGHTS

Centennial Scout-O-Rama

Over 1,000 Scouts, alumni and community leaders packed the Santa Maria Town Center Mall to demonstrate their Scouting spirit and celebrate the 100th birthday of the Boy Scouts of America on February 6.

National Hall of Leadership Inducts Los Padres Council Scout Leader Sam Soga

In celebration of the 100th anniversary, the National office of the Boy Scouts of America inducted one outstanding Scout leader per council into the National Hall of Leadership for their extraordinary service to youth and the Scouting virtues that they have modeled. Sam Soga, an Assistant Scoutmaster from Santa Barbara, was chosen to represent the Los Padres Council for the significant difference he has made in the lives of hundreds of Scouts on the central coast since he first joined Scouting as a youth in Japan over 50 years ago.

2010 National Scout Jamboree

A contingent of 36 Scouts from the Los Padres Council started their journey to the National Jamboree at Fort A. P. Hill, Virginia with a tour of the nation’s capital. With more than 100,000 Scouts, leaders and guests in attendance, it was a spectacular celebration complete with camping, merit badge midway, super activities and two amazing arena shows featuring Secretary of Defense, Robert Gates, Mike Rowe of “Dirty Jobs”, and musical performances by Honor Society and Switchfoot.

Shining Light Across America

For those local Scouts who could not attend the National Jamboree, a live Webcast of the closing arena show was hosted by Allan Hancock College. Over 200 Scouts and their families piled into the Forum auditorium for an evening of fun, games, and interactive participation with their fellow Scouts at the Jamboree.

Centennial Council Camporall

The Los Padres Council lead a council wide campout to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Scouting at the Centennial Council Camporall held at the Santa Maria Elks Unocal Event Center during Halloween weekend. Hundreds of local Scouts participated in Scout skill activities, interactive displays and ceremonies similar to the National Scout Jamboree.
