
# EXAMPLES OF RANDOM ACTS OF SCOUTING

Unsure what to do for your Gorilla Patrol Mission? Here are some examples of marketing activities that others have done to earn their place on the Gorilla Patrol. Feel free to "borrow" an idea, but be sure to attend a Gorilla Patrol Task Force meeting to share your personal Random Act of Scouting.

- Create stickers that feature the Scouting emblem and the words "Scouting Rocks!". Then ask your local fast food restaurant to place on the kids's meal distributed for one weekend.
- Create tray liners that feature fun action shots of your Scout unit's activities, meeting date and location. Ask your school lunch room to place on food trays.
- Conduct a flag ceremony to open the meeting of a local service club.
- Coordinate a flash mob with members of your Scout unit to perform a Scout activity at a local farmer's market.
- Develop a brief PowerPoint quiz on Scouting and ask the manager of the local movie theatre to show at Saturday matinees prior to the movie starting.
- Create mouse pads with Scouting images and place in local libraries.
- Carve wooden posts that read "It's Better Outside. Join Scouting" with the BSA emblem and post in a local park.
- Write pro-Scouting messages on your car windows and drive around town.
- Create a YouTube video of an action packed Scouting function and forward to other Scout parents.
- Do a Scouting presentation at your next Parent Teacher meeting.
- Organize a gathering of parents from your son's school to promote Scouting.
- Obtain **Boys' Life** mini-magazines from Scout Service Center and place stickers on them indicating your next Scout meeting. Then, distribute the mini-magazines to local beauty parlors, barber shops, doctors or dentist offices.
- Wear your Scout uniform and share Scouting stories at your local libraries' next Saturday children's story time. You could even bring Boys' Life mini-magazines.

Any youth or adult who wishes to participate in "Random Acts of Scouting" to promote Scouting may join the Gorilla Patrol

### IS THERE A TIME LIMIT TO JOINING THE GORILLA PATROL

No, you may join at any time. There is no expiration to joining. Start your mission today!

#### **CAN I EARN MORE THAN ONE GORILLA PATROL PATCH**

No, you may only earn one Gorilla Patrol patch. At the time you earn your Gorilla Patrol patch, you are now a Private within the Gorilla Patrol and will receive the Private rocker to go with your patch. You may earn the remaining rocker patches - Sergeant, Lieutenant, Captain, Major, Colonel, and General – with each additional Gorilla Patrol Mission.



### **CAN I PURCHASE ADDITIONAL GORILLA** PATROL PATCHES

No, membership in the Gorilla Patrol is something that you must earn.

#### **CAN YOU DO A GROUP** MISSION WHERE EVERYONE **PARTICIPATES TO EARN A** PATCH

No, membership in the Gorilla Patrol is an individual recognition and is not designed for group recognition.

#### WHAT DO YOU HAVE TO DO TO EARN THE GORILLA PATROL PATCH

Attend a Gorilla Patrol Task Force meeting in your district and share your idea for "your" unique marketing activity, also known as a "Random Act of Scouting" to promote Scouting. By sharing your idea, others may help you to plan out and support your marketing activity. Dates and locations of district Gorilla Patrol Task Force meetings will be posted on www.lpcbsa.org.

Execute your Gorilla Patrol Mission - to conduct a "Random Act of Scouting". If you are a youth, please have an adult leader sign off on your project prior to executina.

Document the success of your Gorilla Patrol Mission by taking a photograph and posting on either the official Gorilla Patrol Twitter account at @Gorilla\_Patrol or the Los Padres Council, BSA Facebook page. If you do not have Internet access, visit one of the three Gorilla Patrol Headquarters (Scout Service Centers) for assistance in posting your photograph.

Debrief the completion of your Gorilla Patrol Mission by completing the official Gorilla Patrol Mission Summary form and submitting to one of the Gorilla Patrol Headquarters.

While executing your Gorilla Patrol Mission, remember to adhere to all the points of the Scout Law.
