THE BASICS

Question: What is Cub Scout Cub-O-Ree?

A. Two days and one night of fun and activities for Cub Scouts and their parents or supervising adults. Programs and activities are provided by trained Program staff. The Boy Scout Order of the Arrow is leading this event and staff will come from OA and other Boy Scout adults and youth. The Order of the Arrow (OA) is the National Honor Society of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA).

Question: Where is Cub Scout Cub-O-Ree?

A. Cub-O-Ree will be held at Magness Adventure Camp. Magness Adventure Camp is located on the west side of Peaceful Valley Scout Ranch in Elbert, Colorado. The camp is about 1 hour drive from downtown Denver, Colorado.

Question: When is Cub Scout Cub-O-Ree?

A. The event starts on Saturday morning September 23rd. Check in starts at 8:00am. Activities start at 10:00am. Departure is after breakfast and activities on Sunday (about 10:00 AM).

Question: Are meals provided at Cub Scout Cub-O-Ree?

A. Meals are served directly to you at the Eagles Nest, Lost Creek and Lizard Head Shelter Houses by Peaceful Valley Scout Ranch and Cub-O-Ree staff.

Question: Where do campers sleep?

- Money for Trading Post: Concessions

- Tent (Camp will NOT be providing tents)
- Sleeping Bag and Pillow
- Cub Scout 10 Essentials (No knives or fire starters)
- Water Bottles (drink lots of water!)
- Sunscreen and Hats
- Wolf/Bear/Webelos Book
- Flashlight or Headlamp
- Medications in Original Container
- **Optional:** Fishing Gear, Camera, Camp Chair (for adults)
