

HEARD SCOUT PUEBLO

FACILITY USE PROCEDURES

All groups and individuals using camp facilities are required to adhere to the following guidelines. **Failure to comply may result in immediate termination of reservations, forfeiture of all fees and deposits and denial of future reservations.**

- A. All groups must conduct themselves in accordance with the Scout Oath and Law, the Outdoor Code and take care to protect the property and facilities and not interfere with the operation of the camp and use by other groups.
- B. All youth groups must be supervised at all times by two (2) adults, at least one of whom is 21 years or older the other must be 18 years or older. Scouting groups must have at least one leader currently registered with the Boy Scouts of America. Co-ed use of camp facilities by persons under the age of 21 years must comply to the policies of the Boy Scouts of America and the Grand Canyon Council, Inc. and be accompanied by adult male and female leadership 21 years or older.
- C. Groups using camp facilities are not allowed to bring pets, firearms, firecrackers, alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs on the property.
- D. **This is a non-smoking facility.** The only designated smoking area is the Ramada adjacent to the main parking lot and then only when children and youth are not present. Use of this facility constitutes your acceptance of this policy.
- E. All groups must comply with all health and safety policies and regulations set forth by the BSA and the Grand Canyon Council including standards and certification requirements for aquatic and field sports activities.
- F. Each group is responsible for removal of their own trash/garbage to the dumpsters. The Camp Ranger will supply trash bags upon the group's arrival.
- G. Campfires are not allowed on no-burn days. Campfires **must** be built in designated fire rings **only** and are at the discretion of the Camp Ranger. **Only one campfire is permitted per campsite.** Units need to furnish their own firewood (no pallets). No bonfires, even in the amphitheaters.
- H. Groups using camp facilities are responsible for damage caused beyond normal wear and tear and for leaving their areas clean.

- I. Group leaders are responsible for insuring members are aware of and comply with camp rules and regulations and health and safety policies.
- J. General access to the camp is by foot. The Camp Ranger may allow one vehicle per campsite to unload/load equipment. The vehicle must then be removed to a designated parking area. RV's and Tent trailers are not allowed in campsites. Equipment trailers may remain **without** the tow vehicle. Parking is allowed only in designated areas. Vehicles must remain on the roadways. Do NOT run over plants and foliage.
- K. Climbing on the mountains and rocks around camp is NOT permitted. There are two (2) improved hiking trails that go out of camp. These may be used with leader supervision.
- L. Units must observe quiet hours from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am. You are still in the City limits.
- M. Group leaders are responsible for possessing their own first aid equipment and giving of first aid care. Group leaders are required to notify the Camp Ranger of any injuries and accidents. *See Heard Scout Pueblo Emergency Procedures.*
- N. Group leaders are responsible for notifying the Camp Ranger or designated representative, if any, all or part of the group leaves the camp during their stay.
- O. Campsites and other facilities used must be left in the same or better condition than you found them.
- P. The Camp Ranger's home, yard and service area are off limits as well as the warehouse on the west end of camp. If you need the Ranger ring the doorbell.
- Q. The Camp Ranger will be available via radio on either ham frequency 147.020 MHZ or on FRS channel 11 PL 12 with arrangements. Units using radios on site must notify the Ranger of frequencies and any command and control nets used for emergency coordination.

Teach your Scouts respect for this fragile desert environment and the facilities provided. Help them understand the need to preserve these things for the use of future generations. Remember, as a leader **YOU** set the example.
