Wood Badge History

Wood Badge was begun by Lord Baden-Powell in England in 1919. He realized that trained leaders would be key to the success of the Scouting movement. To recognize completion of the first training course, B-P chose wooden beads that had been given to him by African chieftain, Dinizulu, during an 1888 military campaign. B-P put the beads on a leather bootlace, a symbol of good luck. Because of these wooden beads, the course was thereafter called "Wood Badge."

For the last 99 years, adult Scouters have continued to benefit from this unique training program.

Who may attend Wood Badge?

To attend Wood Badge, Scouters must:

- Be registered adult members of the Boy Scouts of America.
- Have completed Basic Training for their registered Scouting position, prior to the course.
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A, B and C).

To successfully complete Wood Badge, Scouters must:

- Attend and participate in BOTH weekends of the Wood Badge course.
- Attend the mid-course patrol meetings.
- Complete their Ticket within 18 months (by March 23, 2020).



Course Information

Weekend One - August 24-26 Weekend Two - September 21-23

The first phase of the Wood Badge course is a 2-weekend, fun-filled practical training period where each Scouter lives as a member of a patrol progressing through Scouting, and learning the skills of leadership.

The second phase is the application phase. This is completed at home, implementing the skills learned by accomplishing a series of written goals called a "Ticket."
